

STORY GAMES & TONGUE TWISTERS

One word story (2 or more players)

Team up with a partner or sit in a circle with a group of friends. Each person takes a turn saying **one word out loud** to create a story.

Example:

Player 1 : "long"

Player 2 : "ago"

Player 3: " there"

Player 1: "lived"

Player 2: "a"

Player 3: "mysterious"

Player 1: "horse"

Keep going to see where the story takes you!

Line-at-a-time Story (3 or more players)

Similar to the one word story game, Line-at-a-time story is about creating fun stories with a partner or group.

On a piece of paper, Player 1 writes the starting line of the story. Then, they pass the paper to Player 2 to write the second line. Now, get a second piece of paper, and use it to **cover every line except the one that was most recently written**. Player 2 passes the paper to Player 3 -- Player 3 won't be able to see any of the story except for the most recent line. Player 3 adds a new line and shifts the second piece of paper to cover all lines except the one they just wrote, and passes the story to the next person. No peeking! Make sure you are only reading the line that has been most recently written when it's your turn to add a line. Once everyone has had at least two turns, choose someone to read out the story!

Tongue Twisters

Actors sometimes use tongue twisters to help them warm up before a show. See how quickly you can say these terrifically terrible and troublesome tongue twisters -- or make up some of your own!
