

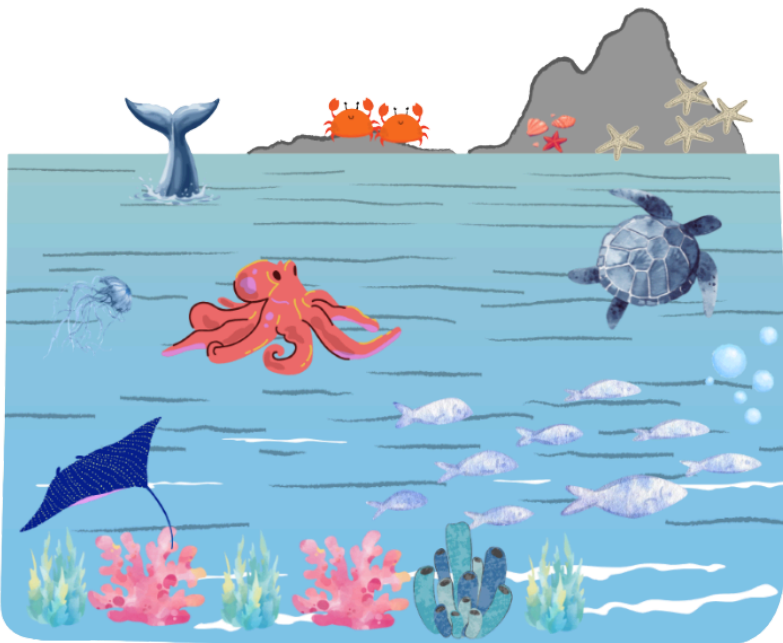
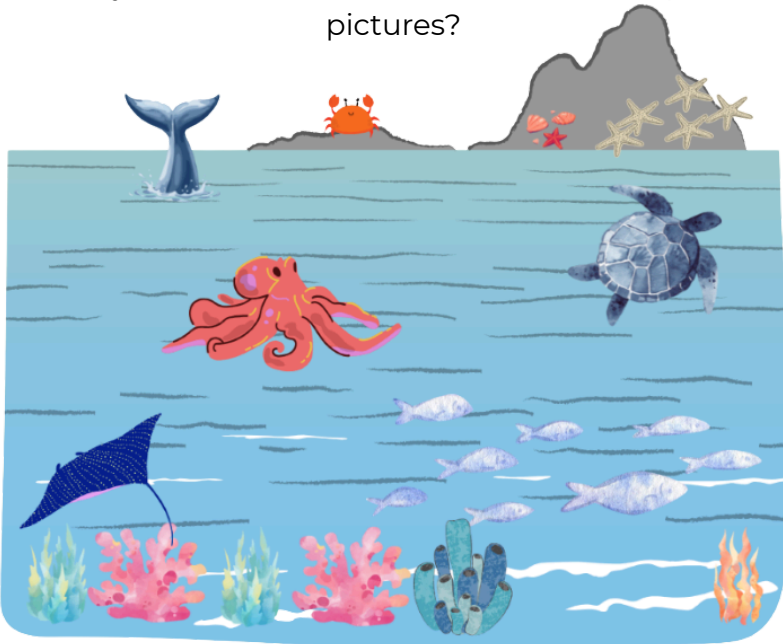

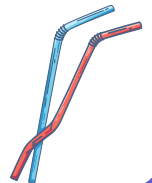
How Can You Help Your Intertidal Zone?

The intertidal zone is the area where the ocean meets the land. It's nutrient rich, but also at risk because of garbage and pollution. Circle the items that don't belong in the intertidal zone!



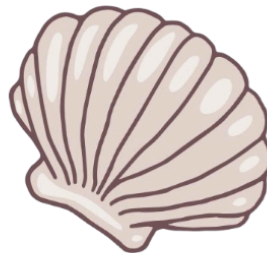

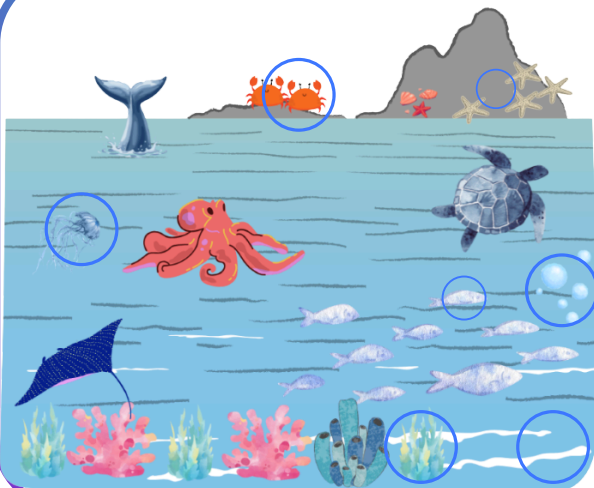
